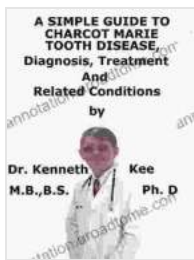

- Charcot-Marie-Tooth disease type 2

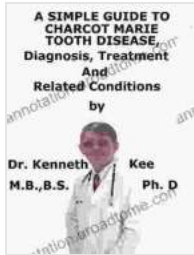
